

Award of Citation

Sixty-six 7 studio is the first phase of a new residence within the Town of Jackson with very modest budget of \$85k. At 350sf of living space on the upper level (NIC stairs), the studio has a functional wet bar with fridge and dishwasher, full bathroom, improvised living/dining area, and a dedicated bunk style sleeping area above the bathroom. This small project houses 1,019 sf. Both size and budget truly distinguish this as a 'small project'.

The design of the studio is largely driven by the legal setbacks of the property and the placement of the main residence to the south. Being situated on the Alley, the garage and driveway will park all of the required spaces for town regulations.

Simple, but not; a stacked wall approach to the upper level would have 'boxed' in the main residence to the south; blocking inviting views to the north. The west and east views are already screened by the mature Aspen trees existing on the site. While the Grand Teton isn't the best view of the upper level, it is present. The grand sits 7 degrees west of north, driving the decision to splay the west wall of the studio, also on the 7 degree orientation. The movement of this wall amplifies the primary views over town and to Rendezvous peak for both the studio and main house.

With this movement, the south wall facing the main residence is minimized in scale. The roof was pitched the same 7 degrees to the north to keep the compound angles tracking at equal proportions. These angled gestures create a dynamic exterior and interior. The interior space above the stairs rises from 8' at the south to over 13' at the opposite corner on the north. These small gestures create an interior space that feels much larger than it is, while doing the opposite at the exterior.

Finishes of the house are what could be characterized as 'traditional'. Their use on the studio transforms them into modern elements. White cedar clapboard wraps the lower box, while clear cedar wraps the studio and the underside of the folded plane. The gray standing seam roof folds over the west side and becomes vertical siding. The colors are crisp; complementing and contrasting the materials to embrace the forms they house.
